Brexit - The Path Ahead For EEA Nationals And Their Family Members

The UK government is shortly to begin negotiations with the remaining 27 EU states on the terms of the UK's withdrawal from the EU. The European Council has indicated that its first priority for the negotiations is to agree on guarantees to protect the rights of EU citizens and their family members.

In a 3 hour seminar, Grace McGill and Darren Stevenson of McGill and Co Solicitors will look at the residency situation for EEA nationals and their family members, along with UK nationals affected by Brexit.
