You Have Been Evicted: New Powers Available

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New powers available to landlords under the Housing (Scotland) Act 2014

Implementation of much of the Housing (Scotland) Act 2014 has taken a considerable amount of time. Finally as of 1 March 2019, the eagerly awaited streamlined eviction process and amendments to short Scottish Secure Tenancy's comes into force. However, will these new powers deliver all that they promise?

This seminar will focus, firstly, on the changes introduced by the (Scotland) Act 2014 including;

- Streamlined eviction process, and the removal of the
- reasonableness requirement
- Changes to short Scottish secure tenancy's
- Tackling antisocial behaviour

and will consider the implications of the changes on dispute resolution moving forward.

The seminar will then turn to look at the issue of proportionality and whether this is simply a new term of reasonableness with a review of legislation and case law.

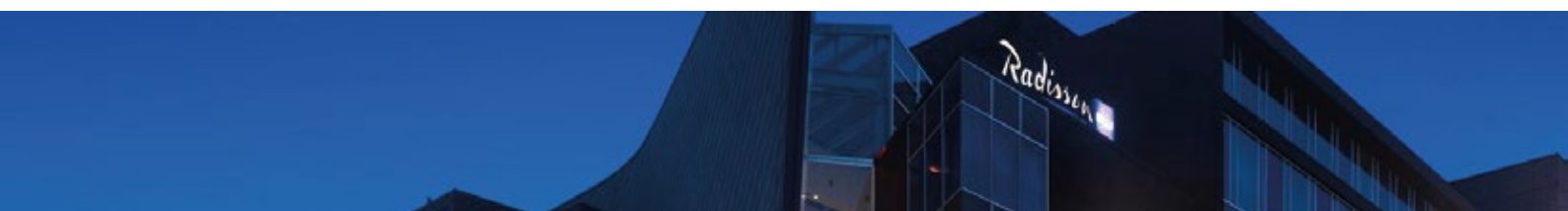
